

Hospital Training For D. Pharm

After completion of their D.Pharm (Part-II) final examination, the students need to undergo a 'Hospital Training' comprises of 500 hours. The training should be taken from a Govt. Hospital. It is obvious to take the training to obtain their registration as Pharmacist according to PCI directives.

Training for B. Pharm (Practice School)

B.Pharm students in the VII semester shall undergo practice school for a period of 150 hours evenly distributed throughout the semester. At the end of the practice school, every student should submit a printed copy/report on the practice school he or she attended. College will assist the students to carry out the training programme.

Industrial Training

B.Pharm students need to carry out industrial training at least 150 hours in a Pharmaceutical Industry, Gluconate Health Care Limited. It includes

Production unit, Quality Control department, Quality Assurance department, Analytical laboratory, Chemical manufacturing unit, Pharmaceutical R & D, Formulation & Development department, Clinical Research Organization etc. College will assist and arrange the training for the students after VI semester and before VII semester.


