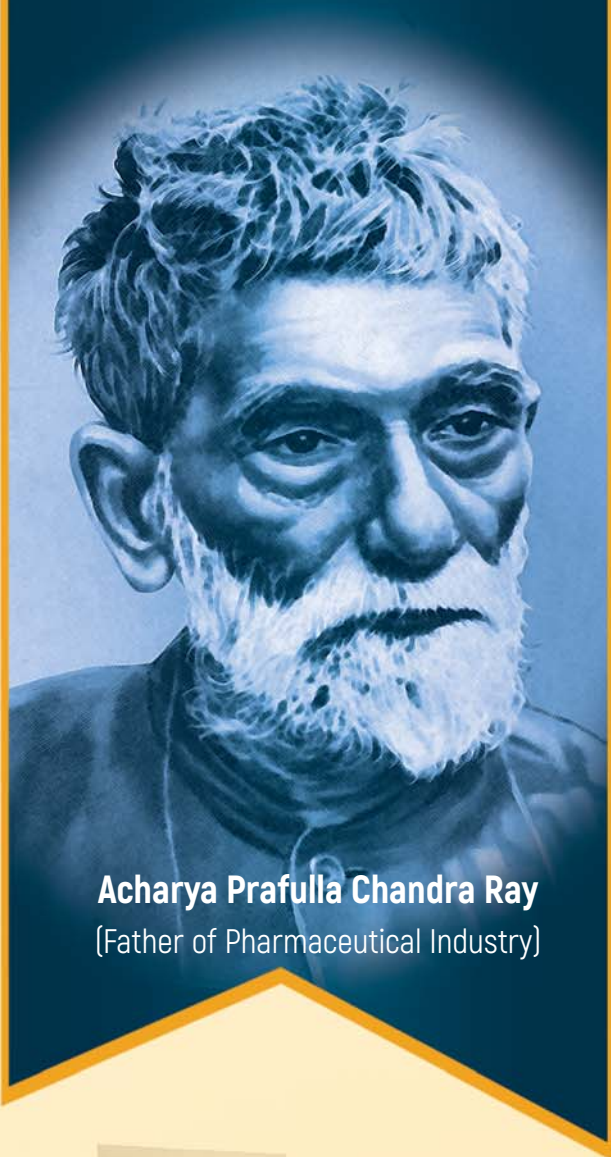

Dear students,



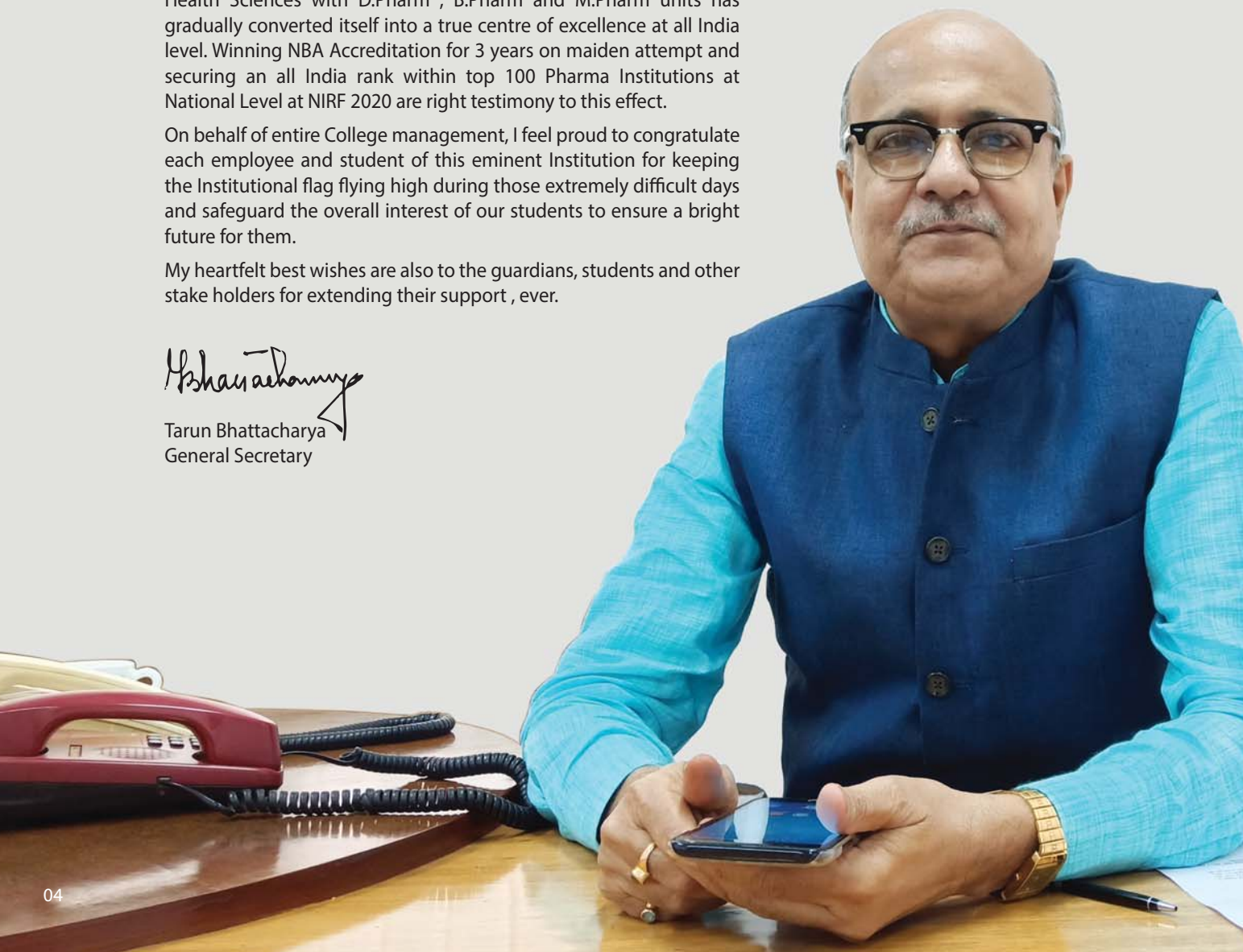

My heartfelt best wishes are also to the guardians, students and other stake holders for extending their support , ever.





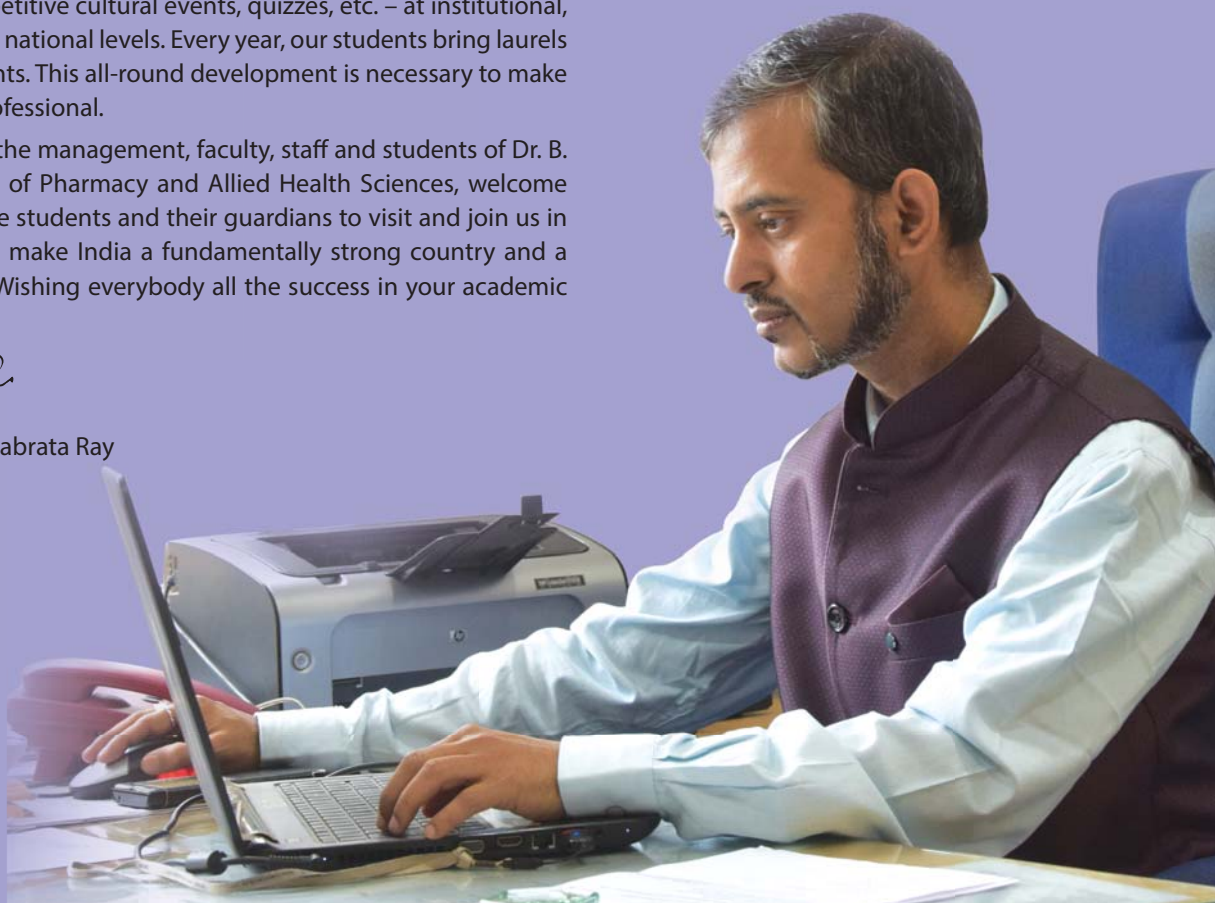

Location

Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences is located at the distinctive location just behind sub divisional Govt. Hospital of Durgapur town. It is in close proximity to vast knowledge application areas and resources.

Durgapur is one of the first planned kinetic industrial cities in the country founded in the late 50s by the Chief Minister of West Bengal, Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. It is the industrial hub of Eastern India and is the home of some of the major public and private sector enterprises belonging to the core sectors such as iron and steel, thermal power, cement chemicals, machinery and other allied industries. In the field of higher education, a deemed university and research establishments, have given the city a national status. The city Durgapur, less than 3 hours by train or by bus from Kolkata, scores high by way of urban comforts, civic amenities and progressive social environment.

Campus Facilities and Amenities

Hostel Accommodation

In-campus hostel accommodation separately for boys and girls with proper security arrangement are provided by the college to accommodate almost all its students. Each hostel provides a decent ambience and a feel-good climate. They are equipped with all amenities for living; dining and recreation that make each inmate feel at home.

Canteen and Common Room

A canteen within the campus provides good quality snacks and meals to satisfy its clients. The common room is built with an idea to host co-curricular activities and cover a diverse range of recreational, sporting, cultural and leisure pursuits.

Gymnasia

A healthy body houses a healthy mind. To sustain multi-purpose fitness gyms have been set up in both the boys and girls hostel. The sophisticated fitness equipment enables students to work out and maintain a good physique resulting in a healthy mind. Qualified male and female trainers are appointed to guide students in building up a healthy body and healthy mind.

Infrastructure Support

The college provides state-of-the-art infrastructure support fulfilling all AICTE norms to all its students who are our greatest resource.

Classrooms

We provide well designed, well ventilated and well lit classrooms for enabling unhindered teaching and learning process with 'convenience' and 'care' as the key elements. These Class Rooms are Smart Class Rooms with Online Teaching and Lecture delivery facilities aided by Smart Boards and Projector Systems.

Laboratories

BCRCP has twenty (20) well equipped spacious Departmental Laboratories for all the subjects of pharmaceutical sciences (Pharmaceutical Analysis, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmaceutics, Physiology, Pharmaceutical Engineering Drawing, Microbiology and Biotechnology, Bio-Pharmaceutics and Pharmacology) as per the educational regulations laid down by PCI, New Delhi as well as AICTE, New Delhi and MAKAUT, Kolkata. Experiments are designed on the basis of theory concept so that the students can understand easily.

Amongst these, BCRCP has two dedicated PG laboratories and two PG research laboratories for specialization in different M. Pharm courses with sophisticated instruments like Dissolution Apparatus, Lyophilizer with deep freezer, Tablet Punching Machine (Ten Station). Probe Sonicator etc. and provide an ambience to create industry-friendly learning environment and also carry out M. Pharm projects smoothly and efficiently.

Language and Simulation laboratory

A well equipped Language Laboratory helps students weak in English to hone up their Language Communication skills under the watchful eye of a full time faculty. The Lab is an air-conditioned networked computer aided facility with dedicated software for developing language skills. A Simulation laboratory has been developed with dedicated software for the students to carry out software based pharmacology experiments.

Animal House

BCRCP has an excellent and well maintained CPCSEA approved animal house with animals like rat, mice & rabbit. Observation room with air conditioned facilities, documentation room etc are also present. Institutional Animal Ethics Committee has been formed as per CPCSEA guidelines. The animal house is an added resource for the field of Pharmacology.



Medicinal Garden

The institute has developed a good number of medicinal and aromatic plants in its well organized Medicinal Garden. These medicinal plants enthrall the students to identify them for demonstration as well as extraction of different kinds of drugs and also to generate an aptitude for research in Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry. Each of our plant in the database has its own unique barcode (QR Code). These codes give students all the information they need to know about the tree -from its scientific name to its medicinal value.

Museum

A pharma museum with display of crude drug samples, photographs of medicinal plants, charts, proprietary medicines, containers, closures etc is established which is informative and educative.



Acharya J. C. Bose Central Library/Resource Centre

The Resource Centre of the college is the upgraded central library with a rapidly increasing collection of text books, reference books, journals, periodicals and CD ROM/DVD discs as well as e-learning facility. At present the library has 12204 number of books, 3370 number of titles, 31 number of journals both national and international. It also provides e-learning facility through NDL & DELNET. The library documentation is done through LIMS and works on open access system from 9:00 a.m to 6:00p.m daily except Sundays and national holidays and is the best zone of the college where the students can develop the ability to learn independently and quietly.

Computer Facilities

The college started using computers from its very inception both in its academic and administrative activities. To cater computing needs to all students and faculty for their professional activities, BCRC provides state-of-the-art computer laboratory. There are modern state-of-the-art computer laboratories for the D. Pharm, B. Pharm & M. Pharm courses within the campus for the use of students and research scholars. The large number of PCs are all connected to the high speed campus LAN. The campus LAN is connected to the Internet through 50-Mbps, 1:1 connection. There are also high quality laser printers, DMP printers, scanners and multimedia projectors.

The B. Pharm computer laboratory is also designed to train the students in basic electronics and computer applications as well as to extend added training on computer aided drug design and molecular modeling (QSAR-study). Computer based MOOCS are also provided through SWAYAM site of GOI.



Acharya P. C. Roy Seminar Hall

The college has a fully equipped seminar hall and auditorium to conduct in-house as well as national seminars and conferences, tech fests and other college events.

Fire Fighting Arrangement

The institute maintains proper fire fighting arrangements to secure the well being of the students, faculty and staff members in case of any fire emergency.

Generator

Care for the students is our main priority and to provide them with comfort during power cuts, generator facility has been added.

Elevator

We believe in providing all state-of-the-art infrastructure support. As part of infrastructural advancement, an elevator has been installed in our campus.

ATM

An ATM facility is available adjacent to the College premises to provide uninterrupted monetary supply to the students, staff, faculty of the institution as well the community nearby.

CCTV

Our campus is monitored 24x7 through CCTV cameras for safety, security and discipline.

Netaji Open Air Auditorium

College has developed a spacious open air auditorium for the students to organize their programmes.

Students Safety Insurance Plan Introduced

Effective from July 2019, students safety insurance has been introduced from a premier insurance organization to be applicable to students from all disciplines (Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate) Each student studying in any College under BCRC Group of Institutions will be covered by the plan and College authorities shall absorb the premia.

Language Lab:

Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences has a fully furnished Language Lab. We have twenty-six computers connected with a Server. Students get the facility to learn English grammar and enhance their vocabulary with the help of the installed software.

PMBJK & Healthcare facility

The institute is a pioneer in the State of West Bengal having Pradhan Mantri Bharatiya Jan Aushadhi Kendra (PMBJK) unit at the college premises. Considering the noble profession Pharmacy, PMBJK offers retail generic medicines at affordable prices. Recently the PMBJK unit has been digitally equipped.

The institute has a medical unit for the treatment of medical issues of inhouse students and faculty members. Our College has a MOU with The Mission Hospital to send doctors to our campus as well as to tackle emergencies.

Free eye and Blood Sugar check-up camp: On PMBJK week our college organized a free eye check-up and blood sugar check-up and it was a grand success.



Instrument & Machine Room

Centralized instrument room is present as an added facility to support experiments of various sorts carried out in the different laboratories. The center of attraction is HPLC, Spectrophotometer, Projection Microscope, Cooling Centrifuge, Trinocular Microscope, Elisa Reader and Washer, Recirculating Chiller, Brookfield Viscometer with small volume attachment, High precision imported pH meter, Eyela Rotavapour and Refrigerated cooling cum solvent recovery facility and Digital Plethysmometer etc. to name a few. Handling such sophisticated instruments facilitate first-hand knowledge of high-level industry instruments. Machine Room of the institute provides the facilities for pilot scale manufacturing of various pharmaceutical dosage forms, including tablets, semisolids etc.

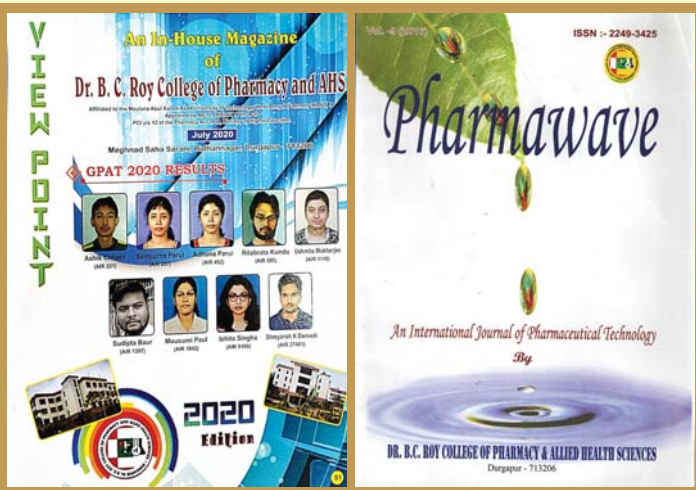
Learning Support

To focus on global vision and integration, the students are provided with 24hrs internet to have access to global content in a multitude of disciplines. To continue learning during pandemic, The College has developed a learning Management System for students for seamless content delivery.

- As a part of Digital India Initiative, the College has become member of NDL (National Digital Library), offered by IIT, Kharagpur, where students can access huge treasure-trove of knowledge from KG to PG and beyond without incurring any additional cost. The platform is also available in mobile phones.
- The college is also offering MOOCs (Massive Online Open Courses) through SWAYAM platform of Govt. of India, to empower students and encourage them in self-paced education.
- The college has developed a fibre-optics backbone to provide very high speed data services with Wi-fi facilities in collaboration with Reliance JIO.

Bachelor Degree in Pharmacy (B-Pharm)

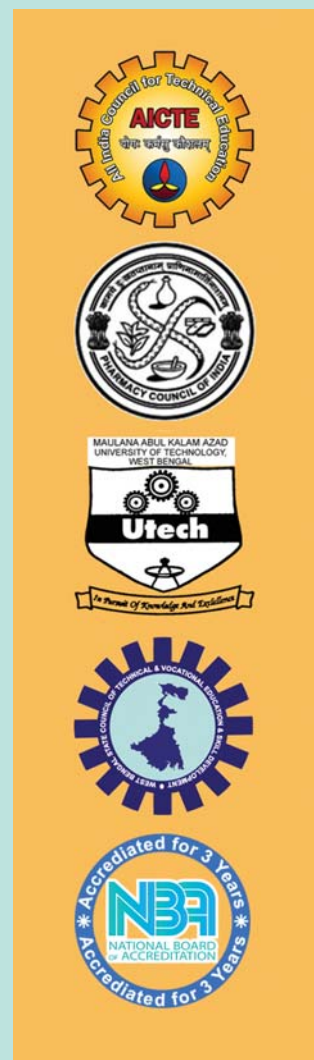
The programme has been designed to integrate the teaching of basic science along with the practice of pharmacy. The course emphasizes the importance of theoretical study, laboratory experiments and also of interdisciplinary communication and research. On the whole, it prepares a strong base for candidates who opt for higher study and research programme in the study of medicines.

Master Degree in Pharmacy (M-Pharm)

M. Pharm is a future oriented specialization programme in the field of pharmacy. It is designed for successful B. Pharm candidates to develop advanced laboratory skills and techniques for application within the pharmaceutical industry as well as spearhead innovative research ideas for further development. In short, it is a gateway for further higher studies to trigger constant up-gradation and rapid progress of pharmaceutical technology.

The two major departments offering M. Pharm are:

- PHARMACEUTICS deals primarily with extended study on drug dosage formulation, drug release pattern, kinetics study, bio-equivalence study and many more.
- PHARMACOLOGY deals with drug action in the biological system as well as check up the toxicity level of drug in the biological system.



NSS Wing : Social Responsibility

Our institute has been highly active in carrying out NSS activities since many years. In the AY 2020-21, students were bound to their homes in the pandemic situation leading to stress and emotional setbacks. Keeping this in mind, the institute organized psychological counseling twice in the academic year with renowned experts from the field of human behavior and psychology to help them deal with the crisis situation and also motivate them to help others in the society going through the same.

Links with Industry & Academia

The institute has been successful in interacting with pharma industries from all over India through industry visits, vocational trainings and assistance in completing M. Pharm dissertations.

Industry visit : Industry visits are arranged for 3rd year students to acquire a knowledge of the recent developments and onsite functioning of pharmaceutical industries.

Vocational Industry Training : Industrial training is an integral part of B. Pharm curriculum & BCRCP has constantly tried to provide hands-on training to its students in industries like Emami, Ind-Swift Ltd, Albert David Ltd, Stadmed Pvt. Ltd., Sunpharma Industries, Baroda, Alkem Pharmaceuticals, Sikkim, Zuentus Pharmaceutical Ltd., Mumbai etc. during their summer vacations. This vocational training prepares the students to be industry-ready pharmacy graduates.

Every year students are encouraged and assisted to have hands-on training in Industries during their semester breaks. This year they have undergone their industrial training at Emami, Alkem, Glenmark, Cipla, Bengal Chemicals, Athena, East India Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Baidyanath, Benmed, Gluconet, Stadmed, Caplet India, Standard Pharmaceuticals, La-Chemico, Allied Analytics, etc. Apart from these, earlier students have visited industries like Ind-Swift, Albert-David, Sun Pharma, Juventus also.

MoU with Industries : The college has signed a MoU with Century Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Gujarat for collaboration on translational research, wherein our students and faculty have the opportunity to visit industrial research labs and carry out their research projects.

Four of our UG students under the mentorship of our faculty, have bagged a short-term research project from SRISTI-BIRAC [Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), DBT, Govt. of India and Society for Research and Initiative for Sustainable Technologies and Institutions (SRISTI)]

MoU with Sumandeep University, Gujarat : The College has signed a technical MOU with Sumandeep University, Gujarat for faculty exchange and scientific collaboration.

MoU with SHRMBIOTECH : The College has recently signed a MOU for training, research and new course development.

Admission

Admission Procedure for D. Pharm

The applicants have to qualify the centralised or Institute-level Common Entrance Test. Questions will be of MCQ type consisting of Mathematics (30 marks), Physics (20 marks), Chemistry (20 marks) & Biology (30 marks) for Diploma in Pharmacy course.

Eligibility Criteria

Candidate should have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination in General Stream Course with Physics, Chemistry & Biology or Mathematics. Candidates passed Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or equivalent examination in Vocational Stream Courses are not eligible for admission, as per prescribed admission eligibility of Pharmacy Council of India.

Candidate shall complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year for admission to the Pharmacy Course.

Admission Procedure for B. Pharm

The applicants will have to qualify West Bengal Joint Entrance (JEE) or JEE(Mains). 90% of the entrants are absorbed from the West Bengal Joint Entrance Examination and 10% students are admitted from JEE(Mains) merit list.

Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must be a citizen of India and should have passed the H.S. (10+2) or its equivalent examination from a recognized Council/Board with :

- Candidate must have passed '10+2' examination with Physics and Chemistry alongwith any one of Mathematics / Biotechnology / Biology / Computer Science /Computer Application as compulsory subjects with individual pass marks (in both theory and practical wherever applicable) in all the three subjects as stated above in regular class mode.
- Must have obtained at least 45% marks (40% in case of candidates belonging to reserved category) in the above three subjects taken together.
- Must have passed English in the '10+2' examination with at least 30% marks.
- The Board of the said Qualifying Examination must be recognized by the Central Government or State Government concerned.
- Candidate will have to qualify at the WBJEE or JEE (Mains) on the year of admission.

Lateral Entry

Admission through lateral entry to the 2nd year (3rd semester level) of the undergraduate degree courses offered by Government/Private Pharmacy colleges of the state of West Bengal during the Academic session 2021-22 is open to candidates who are-

- a) Citizens of india
- b) No upper age limit for Diploma holders in Pharmacy
- c) The candidate must pass Diploma in Pharmacy from PCI and /or AICTE approved Institution with at least 45% (40% for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA.
- d) Candidate should qualify JELET 2020.
- e) Should be able to produce Pharmacist Registration Certificate within one Month of Admission.

Admission Procedure & Eligibility for M. Pharm

The applicant must be a citizen of India and should have passed B. Pharm with first Class Degree or Equivalent from any recognized University. GPAT qualified candidates will be given preference. Applicants will be selected through University Selection Test (PGET). Information Brochure and Application form can be downloaded from the University website (www.makaut.ac.in). Candidates without valid GPAT score and PGET are also eligible to apply subject to availability of seats. They must produce Pharmacist Registration Certificate within one Month of Admission as per PCI directives. As per PCI requirement, for M. Pharm admission 55% marks (50% for SC/ST) is needed in B. Pharm.

College Rules and Regulations

College Registration

All the students will have to register their names at the beginning of each semester. Failure to do so will debar them from all facilities.

Attendance

Each student is required to have at least 75% attendance in theory and practical classes; otherwise he/she will be debarred from appearing the semester examination (For B.Pharm & M.Pharm) under MAKAUT norms. (80% attendance for Diploma students is mandatory as per PCI norms)

Removal from college rolls

The name of the students will be automatically removed from the college roll if:

1. he/she fails to pay up his/her dues in time
2. he/she remains absent from classes or hostel for more than 15 days without prior intimation
3. he/she, otherwise eligible, does not deposit any examination or admission form without prior permission from the Principal

Discontinuation of studies

In case a student opts for discontinuation of his/her studies in the stream he/she is enrolled, he/she will have to make payment of his/her due semester fees and only then, he/she will be issued transfer certificate. In case the student opts for joining other college, he/she must obtain NOC from the college giving a declaration that he or she had no claim whatsoever subsequently on the said seat. In case he/she does not obtain NOC, all deposits will be forfeited.

Discipline

All students must abide by the rules and standing orders of the college, violation of which or any misconduct inside or outside the college campus may lead to disciplinary action as per the regulations and render a student liable to expulsion from the college. Students have to sign an undertaking to this effect for the above during admission.
